Legend has it that Norwich once had 365 pubs, one for each day of the year! The city is well known for its great beers and friendly pubs, many of which have live music one or two nights a week. In addition, venues such as Norwich Arts Centre and The Waterfront offer a wide range of live music, dance and theatre.
