You will create teaching tools that encourage action on climate change, adapt materials to focus on the environment, understand how language shapes future leaders, and learn how to handle tough topics by integrating climate education into every lesson. This course guides teachers to inspire a generation of proactive citizens, from the classroom to the world.
