Accommodation in Norwich

- Residential accommodation is provided on the campus of the University of East Anglia in single en-suite study-bedrooms, in
 university 'houses' or 'flats' with a shared kitchen/dining room equipped for self-catering and, if in half-board accommodation,
 includes two meals a day.
