In this course you will look at both the theory and practice of the use of educational technologies (EdTech) in language teaching and training. The course will introduce you to a wide variety of technologies, tools and approaches from both a theoretical perspective and a practical angle, with hands on sessions focussing on EdTech materials design and delivery. By participating on the course you will learn where technology fits into the language learning process, and apply the new skills experiences you have gained to your own particular work context.

Who is the course suitable for?

- Teachers and trainers wanting to learn about the application of technology in teaching and training
- Teachers wishing to extend their EdTech knowledge and usage
- Participants should have a minimum language level corresponding to B1/B2 on the Common European Framework

Content

Technology Assisted Language Learning includes content drawn from some or all of the following areas:

- A theoretical overview of EdTech core concepts
- An introduction to digital literacy
- Incorporating websites into your teaching
- Interactive whiteboards (IWB) in the language classroom
- Working with media production (audio, video)
- Mobile and handheld learning
- Webquests and task-based learning
- Web design – getting started with WordPress
- Online and blended course design
- The flipped classroom
- EdTech & continuing professional development (CPD)

The afternoon sessions provides the opportunity for the practical application of the mornings' input with support from the tutor, essential for the outcome of the course.

Specific course content comes from feedback you and other participants give us through pre-course questionnaires, identifying your needs and priorities.

We build time into the course for reflection, to consider how to adapt the content to your own professional context.

We then support you in creating a strategy for putting your ideas into practice on returning to your institution.

All NILE courses involve a significant element of English language improvement and/or the development of language awareness.

This course consists of 50 hours of tuition, delivered between 09:15 and 16:00, Monday - Friday. You will also take part in cross-curricular workshops on a variety of topics, and each course includes a free evening and weekend programme of social and cultural activities and trips.
